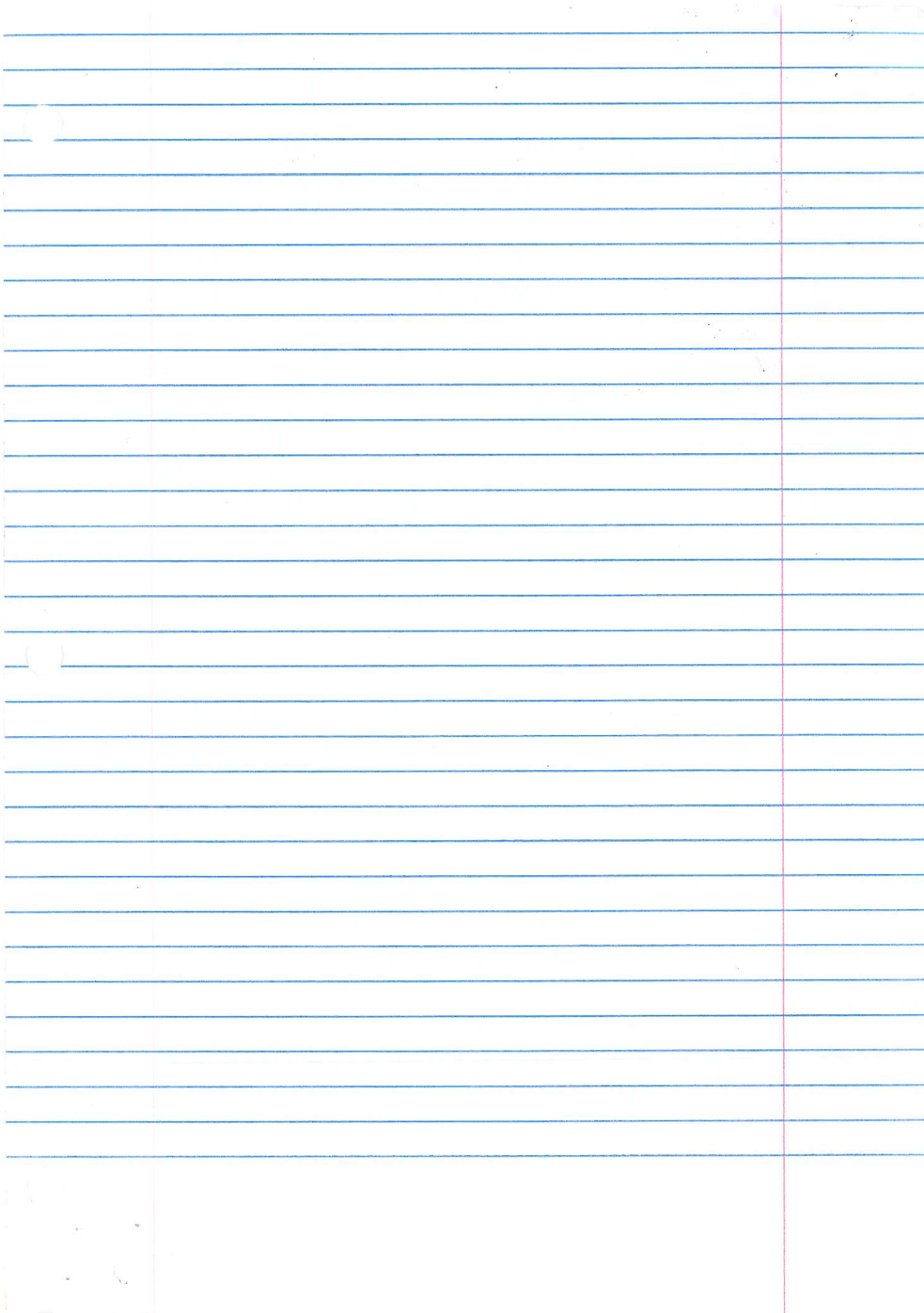

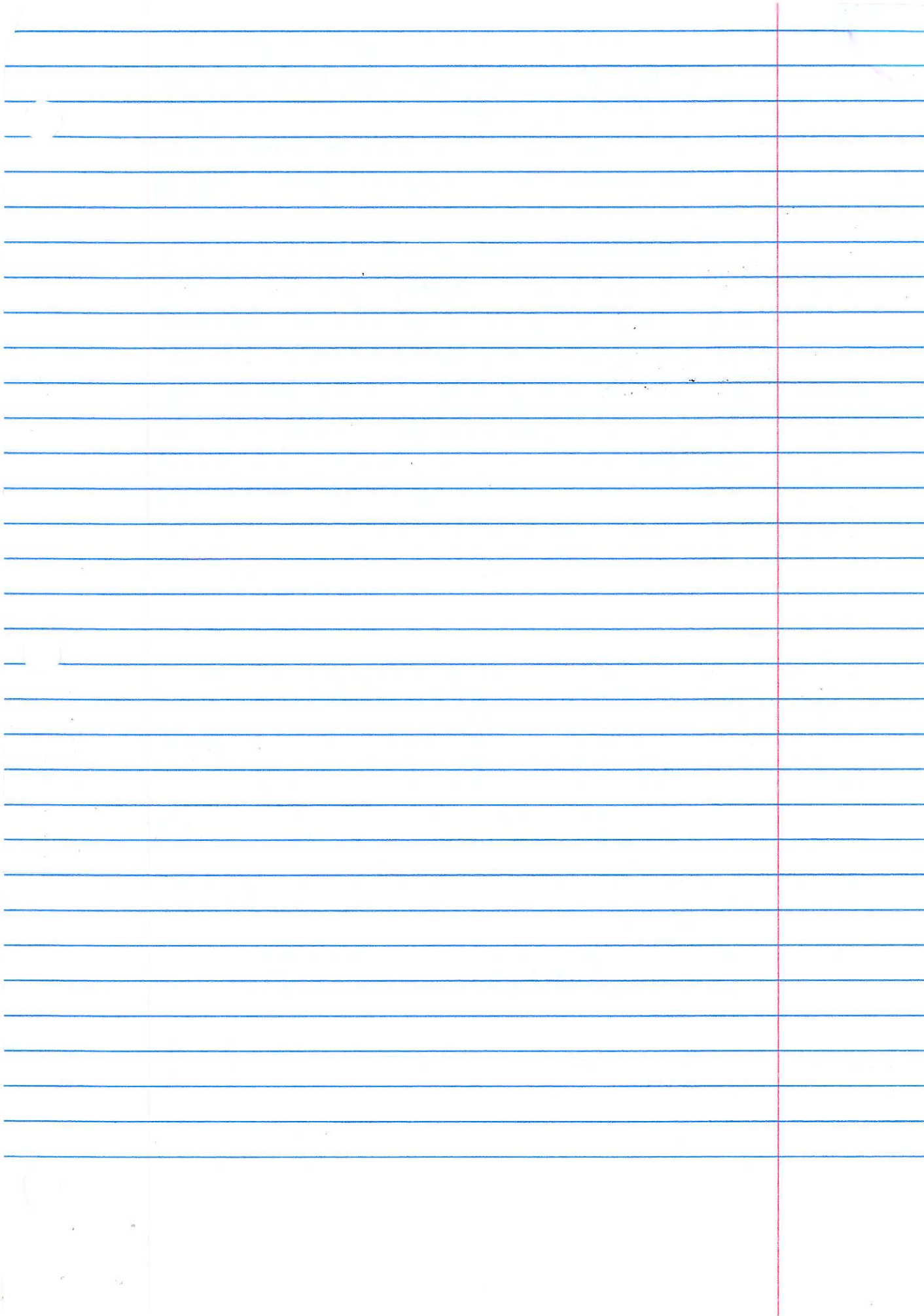


- during dry seasons when there isn't much rain. Conserving water helps avoid those situations before they even start.
